The AUPP Credit Transfer Program

Your pathway to international success

Studying abroad with a view to working internationally are popular career pathways for many young people. Some students, however, will postpone plans for overseas study due to:

- an absence of clear guidelines and up-to-date information
- concerns about English language proficiency
- the perceived high cost of studying abroad
- a lack of immediate finances required to secure a student visa.

AUPP has proven strategies to help tackle these challenges

Feeling confident in speaking and understanding English is an important part of readying students to learn and work internationally.

The first year of AUPP allocates time and resources to developing students' English comprehension and conversational skills. At the end of the first year, students undertake the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test, with the aim of securing a score to qualify for admission into the second year of an Australian university program.

Additionally, studying with AUPP gives students an extra year to save the funds to meet the financial requirements for securing a student visa.

The process of securing a visa and a letter of offer can take some months. With AUPP, students can study and prepare for an overseas education while their visa and passport applications are being processed.

Once students receive a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) from ATMC University Partners they can apply for a Student Visa.

Post-Study Work Visa for Australia and New Zealand

AUPP's skills transfer program is offered through dedicated centres located across India and the Subcontinent. AUPP provides career-oriented education through best of curriculum facilities and technology.

A unique Block Skills Transfer program - focused on information technology, information systems, business studies and accounting – gives students the opportunity to study for 10 months locally before completing their remaining two years of study in Australia/New Zealand.

After the initial 10 months of local study, the student becomes eligible to apply for credit transfers to secure admission directly into the second year of an Australian or New Zealand bachelor degree.

AUPP students, post completing their course, will have access to ATMC's prestigious partner universities, offering industry-leading programs and prepare students for significant employment opportunities post study.

After completing a bachelor degree from an Australian or New Zealand university, students may be eligible for a two-year Post-Study Work Visa in Australia and a three-year Post-Study Open Work Visa in New Zealand.

Graduating students may also apply for Permanent Residency (PR), subject to prevailing local regulations.

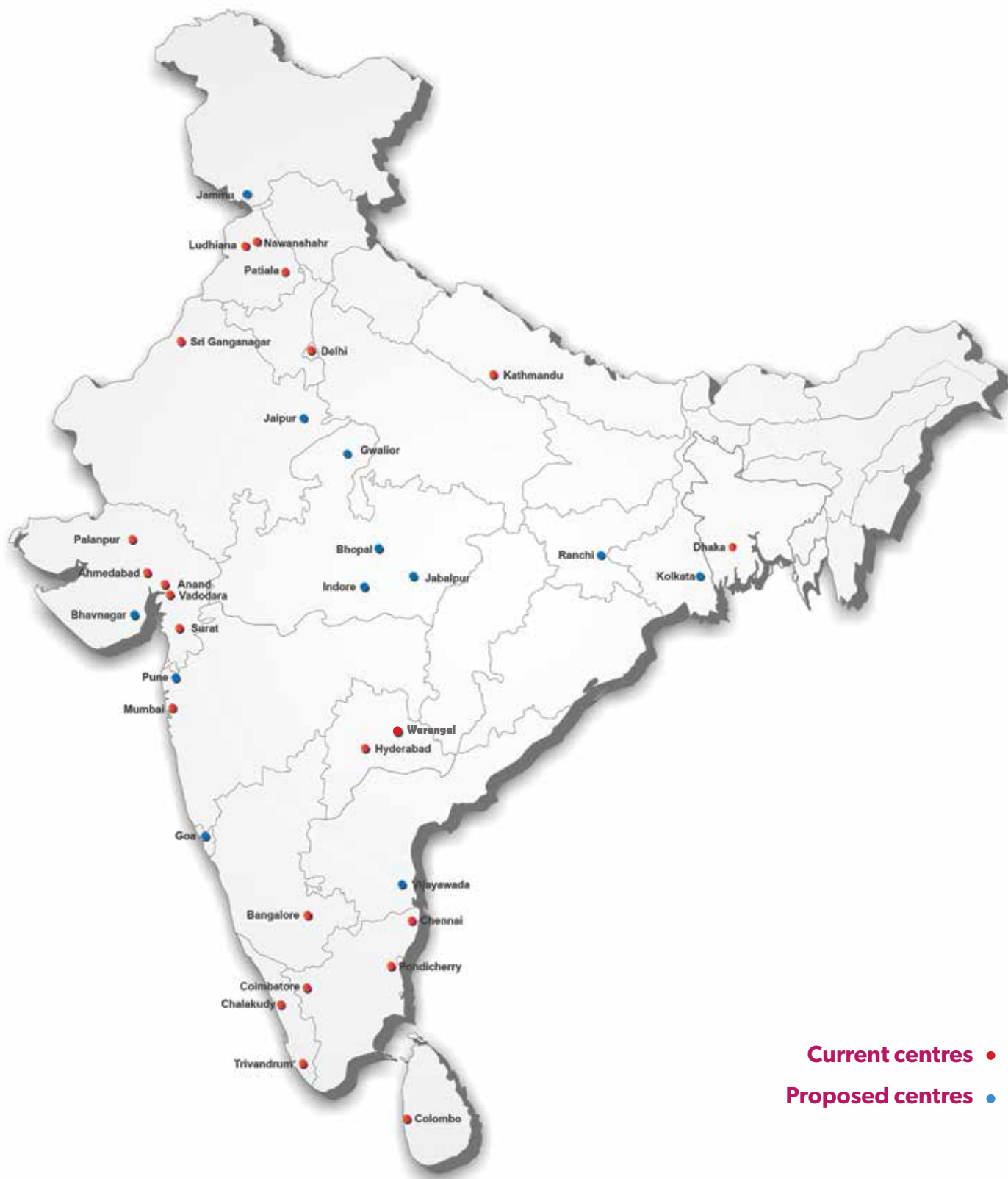

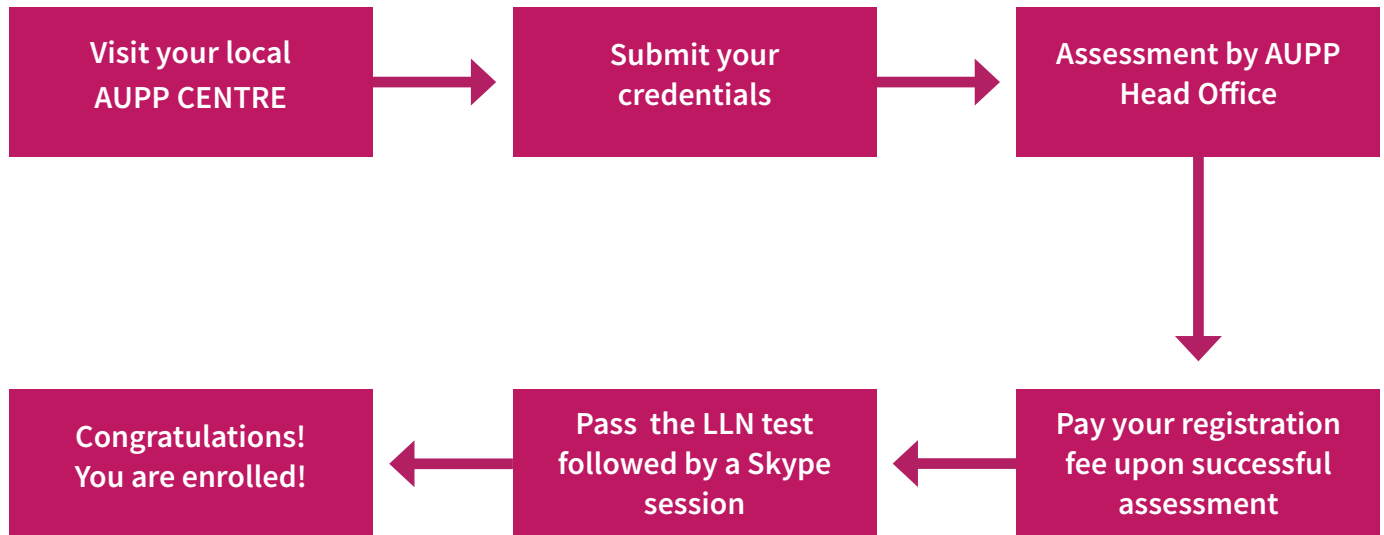

Duration

Students study for 10 months at their local AUPP centre and complete the remainder of their two years of study with ATMC Academic Partner University, Federation University Australia. During the 10 months of local study, students must successfully complete the Australian International Pathway Program as per the requirements of Australian Government standards.

Study credits earned through local AUPP centres are transferred to the next year of study in Australia. These qualifications are delivered under the Higher Education category of the Australian education system.

Credits

Credits are gained for the successful completion of modules of study. For example, post successful completion of year 12 schooling with minimum percentage outlined in entry requirement and successful completion of AUPP pathway would grant up to 1 year of credit exemption in relevant Federation University bachelor degree.

How it works

Your credit score is carried into the next academic year. For example, you achieve a score to qualify for the 12th standard and wish to take up a Bachelor of Information Technology at Federation University. You will receive the following exemptions subject to meeting admission requirements.

The Advanced Computing Diploma qualification is designed to prepare students for education in English speaking countries such as Australia.

Course units are designed in reference to an internationally recognised education system. Students receive recognition of prior learning/ credit on completion of these units providing pathways to study with leading universities in Australia

This course provides students with the skills and knowledge needed to develop competencies in software development, business information system, project management and to administer and manage information and communications technology (ICT) support in small-to-medium enterprises (SMEs) using a wide range of general ICT technologies.

Course Overview

The Advanced Business Management Diploma qualification is designed to prepare students for studies in English-speaking countries. Pathways to international degrees (Western Sydney University)

Course units

Course units will develop your knowledge and competence across a range of IT disciplines including software development, business information systems (BIS), and project management.

Subjects also cover administering and managing information communications technology (ICT) for small-to-medium enterprises (SMEs) and large corporations.

Credits

Credits are gained for the successful completion of modules of study. Normally, 10 study hours earns one credit. This time includes contact time, private study time, as well as time spent preparing for undertaking assessments.

AUPP Entry Requirements

Eligibility criteria

Any student who has successfully completed Class 12 is eligible to apply to the AUPP for Australia.

People with IT, Arts and Business Diplomas may also apply for the AUPP.

The English language requirements for all academic programs requires an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) overall band score of 6.0 with no individual band score less than 5.5 or equivalent.

Refund policy

If AUPP is unable to start a course on an agreed start date, the student will be refunded full pre-paid tuition fees.

- If the course has been cancelled by AUPP during a study period, student will be refunded for all pre-paid tuition fees.
- In the event the student fails to commence any course on agreed start date, there will be no refund of that course fee.
- If the student withdraws from a course on or after the commencement date, the total tuition fee is payable to AUPP and is nonrefundable.
- If any student's enrolment is cancelled by AUPP due to misconduct or unsatisfactory academic progress, all unpaid tuition fees are payable to AUPP and there will be no refund of any pre-paid tuition fees for current and subsequent courses.
- In the event AUPP cancels its offer based on fraudulent documents and/or misleading information provided by the student, the total of any unpaid tuition fees is payable to AUPP and is non-refundable. There will be no refund of pre-paid tuition fees for the initial and subsequent courses.
- All the fees are payable as per details given in the invoice.

AUPP reserves the right to amend the above terms and conditions at any time to ensure compliance with State and Federal laws and/or to amend the non-refundable enrolment fee.





Life in Australia

Australia has the world's highest proportion of migrant settlers in a developed country, with more than 25% of its citizens born overseas. Australia is renowned for its spectacular natural wonders, peaceful culture, a stable political system and love of sport! This region has so much to offer ... and as an international student there is so much to learn.

Food in Australia

Australian food has been influenced by the cooking styles of the people who have arrived over the years. There is an emphasis on fresh, locally-sourced produce and you'll also find an abundance of local Indian, Asian and Middle-Eastern specialty grocers across metropolitan areas.

Historical influence

Aboriginal Australians arrived on the continent over 60,000 years ago and have one of the oldest continual civilisations on earth. Indigenous Australians have an oral culture with spiritual values based on respect for the land and a belief in the Dreamtime. Modern Australia was claimed for the British by Captain Cook in 1770. The First Fleet arrived in Sydney Harbour in 1788 to establish a penal colony that became the first European settlement in Australia.

Communication

For most international students, Australia are a long way from home. Staying in touch with loved ones is easier through the internet and phone. Depending on your country of origin, phone cards and mobile phone plans should allow you to communicate internationally at reasonable prices.

Finding a place to live

Finding a place to live when you arrive in Australia will be an important first step, especially if you are moving with your family. Our advice is to be prepared for the high cost of housing. Rent in capital cities tends to be expensive and the vacancy rate is currently low. Be sure you plan ahead and look into share housing options.

Culture

You will probably notice some lifestyle differences between Australia and your home country. For example:

- Australians are quite informal and will refer to their lecturers and tutors by their first names.
- They expect everyone to be treated equally. It is customary to thank shop assistants and other service staff when they assist you.
- Being punctual is very important. If you are going to be late for an appointment, it is polite to call ahead.

Living costs

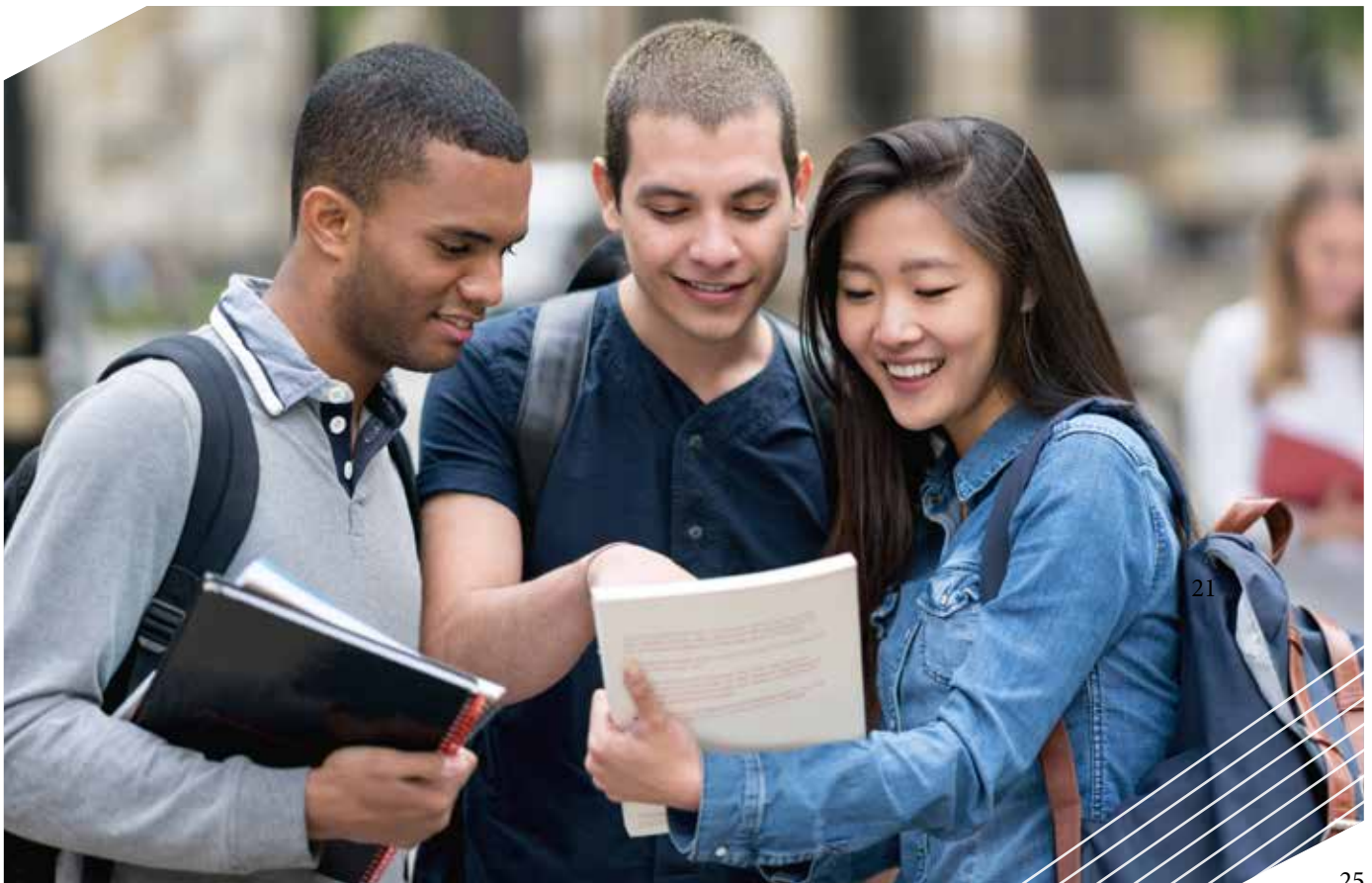
Your living costs will vary according to factors such as your lifestyle and location. The Australian Government has provided the following guide as to what you might expect to spend on living expenses each week.

Groceries and eating out:	AUD\$140 to \$280 per week
Gas and electricity:	AUD\$10 to \$20 per week
Phone and internet:	AUD\$15 to \$30 per week
Public transport:	AUD\$30 to \$60 per week

Typically, the capital cities have the highest living costs, with the biggest cities – Sydney and Melbourne – usually being at the upper end of the spectrum and smaller cities such as Adelaide and Hobart being the cheapest.

Safety

Oceania is a diverse and multicultural region. You will find that locals welcome international students and celebrate the many cultures and countries from which they come. That said, as with other countries around the world, it is not free from crime and new arrivals should observe the same precautions as they would when travelling anywhere, whether at home or overseas.



Job outlook in Australia

The Australian job landscape is changing as new technologies are introduced, businesses adapt to new ways of working, and the Australian Government and industry responds to challenges such as COVID-19.

There is likely to be demand in industries where employment has grown strongly in recent years, including:

- health care and social assistance
- professional, scientific and technical services
- education and training
- construction

Careers in Information Technology

The number of people working as software and applications programmers grew strongly from 121,300 in 2018 to a projected 146,800 by 2023. There are likely to be around 80,000 job openings over five years.

- **Location**

Software and applications programmers work in many parts of Australia. New South Wales and Victoria have a large number of workers.

- **Industries**

Most work is in the professional, scientific and technical services; financial and insurance services; and public administration and safety.

- **Earnings**

Full-time workers on an adult wage earn around \$2,003 per week (higher than the average of \$1,460). Earnings tend to be lower when starting out and become higher as the worker gains more experience.

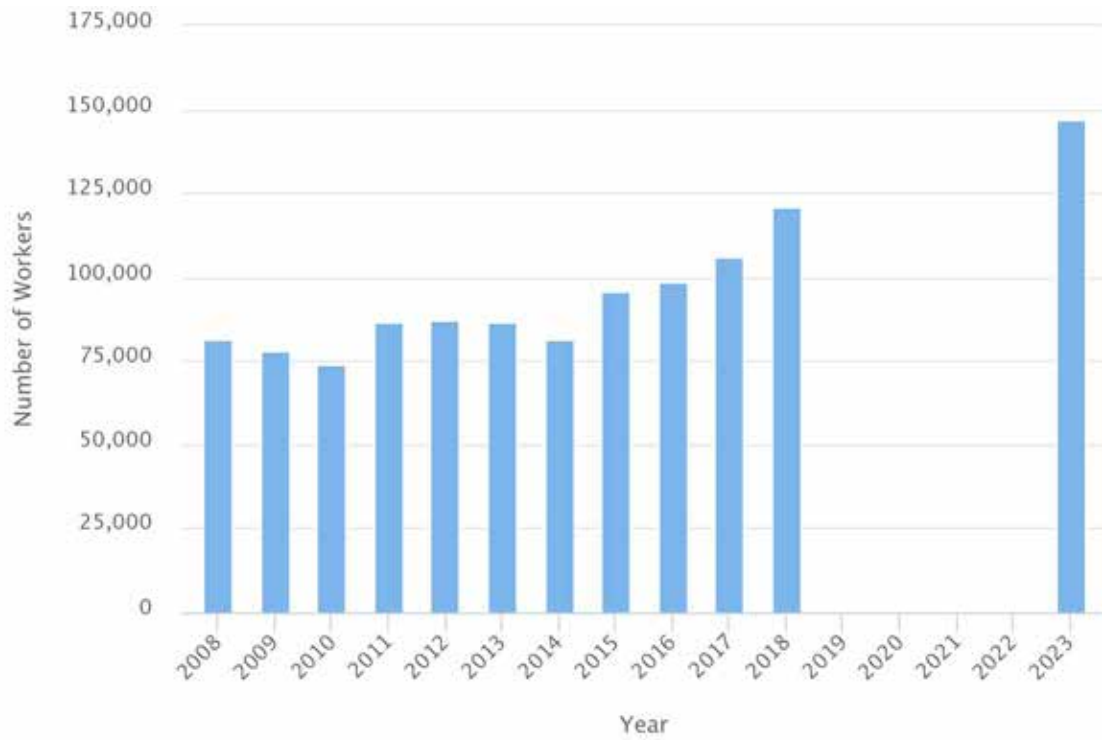
Most work full-time (90%, much higher than the average of 66%).

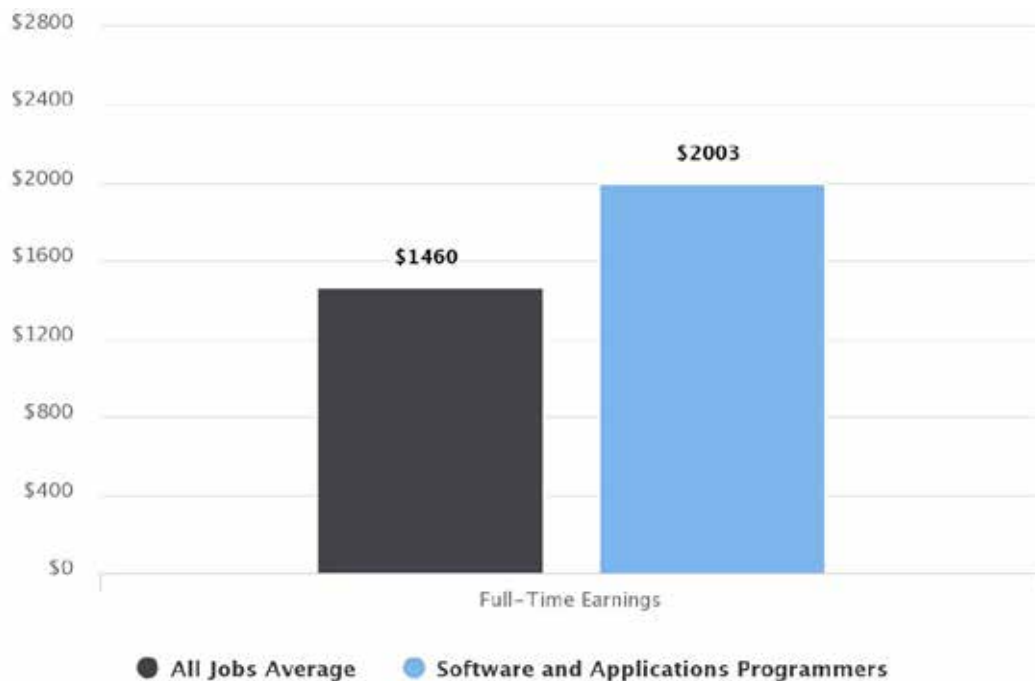
Full-time workers spend around 41 hours per week at work (compared to the average of 44 hours).

Abroad Unified Pathways Program is for aspirants wishing to pursue an international degree immediately after the completion of Class 12. AUPP programs prepare students to transfer to the information technology and business management degrees, Students study for one year in India and gain credit towards admission to the second year of undergraduate degrees in Australia or New Zealand.

What is credit transfer?

Credit transfer is a process that provides students with credit for learning outcomes they already have achieved, allowing for entry into a qualification and/or provide credit towards the qualification. Credit given may reduce the time required for a student to achieve the qualification. AUPP credit transfer program provides students with credits towards programs of ATMC partner universities in Australia and New Zealand.

Is credit transfer applicable for Australia and New Zealand only?

This is a global program, which is accepted in most Asia-Pacific countries including Malaysia Singapore and China but our focus is Australia and New Zealand. These countries provide a very safe learning environment and the opportunity to receive a quality education.

What is the local AUPP centre fee?

The details of fee structure for a local education centre can be obtained from the regional AUPP audited centre (ACC). The fee is separate from the course tuition fees to be paid.

What kind of job will I get overseas?

Indian students may find employment in a range of roles in Australia or New Zealand. As students have already completed AUPP in India, their general skills of IT business management and accounting may increase their chances of obtaining part-time employment in their area of specialisation.

Can I pay the fee in monthly instalments?

Yes, there are instalment plans available. Please ask a representative from your local AUPP centre.

How many hours per week do I need to study?

You need to allow at least 40 hours per week for study in Australia.

How does AUPP lead to study in Australia?

After successfully completing AUPP certification, students receive block credit exemptions towards entry into the second year of the various corresponding degree programs with an ATMC Academic Partner University, however it will depend on the credit evaluation of their present studies.

Do I need to pay extra at the time of visa filing?

Visa application is free of charge and supported by the best consultants who have extensive experience with Australian Government's visa processing requirements.

What are the support services in Australia and New Zealand?

ATMC has a comprehensive student services team to assist students with advice on accommodation, retail-based training and job placement assistance.

Does AUPP have a student loan arrangement with Indian banks?

Will I be on par with the classmates in Australia?

The majority of AUPP students will be on par with Australian classmates. Students pursuing bachelor degrees may apply to join second year directly from institutions across Asia and the Subcontinent. This is a very common education pathway in Australia.

Can the average student cope with higher education studies in Australia?

The education system in Australia is very interactive and practical. Diligent students will be able to manage the workload and academic requirements.

What other preparations or training should a student undertake before going to Australia?

AUPP will provide all the information you need to prepare for living and studying in Australia.

Can I change my subjects after arriving in Australia?
